Degree requirements:
175 credit hours distributed over 10 semesters
The cumulative GPA should not be less than 2 +
Passing the university's requirements for graduation + Passing a field training period with a total of 100 actual training hours
total grades of a subject= total grades of (mid-terms + practical+ written + oral) and the minimum requirements to pass in any course is 60% of its total degrees



Duration of study : five academic years (five levels over ten semesters) according to the credit hours system + one year training (excellence) in the workplace + 100 hours field training

The year of training (excellence) = training courses in the various areas of clinical pharmacy + one training course in the field of pharmaceutical manufacturing and other + The student also presents a graduation project in a particular specialty



The student's workload in any semester must not be less than 12 credit hours and not more than 22 credit hours

Areas of work for graduates of this program

Clinical Pharmacy

In the field of specialization (during the training period and graduation project) for a year / two years to become a pharmacist specialized in one

of the different clinical professional disciplines

Work in private or governmental pharmacies

The academic field :teaching and scientific research



Each level (academic year) is divided into two semesters (fall and spring) and each semester is 15 weeks. Some courses may be offered in a 6-8-weeks of intensive study during summer semester
