


Program Admission Requirements

Why the Specialized Translation Program in Italian?

- The program combines the longstanding heritage of Ain Shams University and the Faculty of Al-Alsun with the academic flexibility offered by the credit-hour system.
- It offers specialized courses in various fields of translation, such as media, economic, tourism, military, conference interpreting, and translation of international organization documents.
- It contributes to developing a diverse knowledge base that aligns with labor market requirements.
- It offers opportunities to develop conversation, reading, and writing skills through instruction by native-speaking lecturers.
- It enhances the quality of education through collaboration with prestigious international academic institutions.





Language of Instruction

Specialized courses are taught in **Italian** as the primary language, in addition to courses taught in **Arabic**, as well as in **English** as a second foreign language.

Number of Study Years / Credit Hours Required for Graduation

A four-year program comprising 144 credit hours, divided into four levels over eight semesters (with a minimum duration of 14 weeks per semester).

Field Training During Study

- Field training is a graduation requirement, whereby the student must finish 60 hours of training.
- The program qualifies its students for training at various organizations, such as:
 - Tourism companies
 - Airlines
 - Media institutions
 - Information technology companies
 - Schools

Agreements and International Cooperation

- A cooperation agreement with the University for Foreigners of Siena in Italy, providing training opportunities for outstanding students.
- An agreement with the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs to support the program with native-speaking instructors.
- The Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs supports the program with books and educational materials.
