Profile & Research Summary

I am a Lecturer (Assistant Professor) of Greek and Roman History at Ain Shams University, with a dual focus on documentary papyrology (Greek and Arabic) and digital approaches to ancient and medieval history. My research examines the administrative, social and economic history of Ptolemaic and Roman Egypt by combining close readings of papyri and ostraca with archaeological evidence and digital tools. I have published a scholarly monograph in the *Papyrologica Coloniensis* series (Brill | Schönningh), peer-reviewed articles in journals such as *BASP*, *ZPE* and *IWNW*, and several edited volumes and Arabic-language studies. In parallel, I am actively engaged in digital history and digital papyrology, using TEI-XML and online corpora to produce accessible editions and teaching resources that link Greek and Arabic documentary cultures.
